Gandhi - 7 sins

- Wealth without work get something for nothing, through manipulation
- Pleasure without conscience hedonism, abandon others (eg spouse) to fulfill our own desires no consideration of others abandon one's duty
- Knowledge without character dangerous, unprincipled use of power
 - *MLK: Educating the mind without educating the heart is no education at all.*
 - Gandhi: Education that does not mould the character is absolutely worthless.
- Commerce without morality golden rule, fair treatment of others in business, win-win, serve all stakeholders
- Science without humanity victims of technocracy, create new innovations but no benefit for most, increase inequalities
 - *MLK: Our scientific power has outrun our spiritual power. We have guided missiles and misguided men.*
 - *Einstein: Science without religion is lame and religion without science is blind.*
- Religion without sacrifice
 - - walk the talk, not just rituals, Swami Vivekananda Service of mankind is the worship of God
- Politics without principle principle is pole star, to guide, without it no integrity, only popularism
 - Thomas Jefferson: Government exists for the interests of the governed, not the governing.

John Rawls - A Theory of Justice - Justice as Fairness, 1971

Based on a "social contract"

Says justice is the first virtue of social institution - good society is structured according to principles of justice

- Seeks reconciliation of liberty and equality in a well-ordered society
- 2 Principles
 - The Greatest Equal Liberty Greatest possible liberty given to members of society, limited only so that liberty of one does not infringe on others
 - The Difference Principle Social or economic inequalities only allowed if worst off will be better off than under equal distribution - and Equal Opportunity Principle -> positions of power must be open to all with equality of opportunirty

Through a fair choice situation - Original Position with a Veil of Ignorance

- Everyone decides principles of justice from bejind a veil of ignorance no one knows his place in society
 - In ignorance, less likely to privilege minority, but treat all fairly (maxi-min strategy) to maximize prospects of least well off
 - Rational and free person to further their own interests would accept these

Structure of Original Position ensures structure of just society will be fair.

Shows how moral conclusions can be reached without abandoning prudential standpoint

Chanakya - Arthashastra

public proclamation and enquiry, Whistleblowers rewarded, public embarassment, compensation for corruption from criminal false allegations punished, sting operations to identify loose morals, strict auditing and accounting of expenditure, revenue Network of spies to detect

7 Heavenly Virtues (Catholic Church)


Defines virtue as a habitual and firm disposition to do good
